NOTE: Although many family trees say Ann Gwaltney was the wife of Edward Boykin, this apparently has been shown to be inaccurate.

Edward Boykin & Ann of Isle of Wight Co., Virginia, Timeline

Abt 1650 England or Wales. Edward Boykin was born to unknown parents, possibly in County Kent, England.

03 Jul 1678 Edward Boykin may have been aged about 28 years:
Isle of Wight Co., VA. Thomas Took, planter, sold to Nicholas Cobb 900 acres bought from Wm. Took. Nicholas Cobb sold to Thomas Tooke land adj. James Manning and Edward Boykin.[1]

20 Apr 1685 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin patented 525 acres on Blackwater in consideration of the transportation of eleven persons into the Colony. Adj. Mr. Williamson's corner tree, M. E. Thomas Moore's line,.....

23 Jan 1690 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Nathaniel Bacon granted to John Sojourner 162 acres adj. land of Robert Williamson to James Atkinson's corner, to Ed Boykins, for trans. of 4 persons.[2]

09 Aug 1692 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Arthur Allen of Lawrence Creek Parish in Surry County sold 525 acres to Edward Boykin at northwest side of Blackwater Swamp, (being a patent granted him on 20 Oct 1691) adjoining Mr. George Williamson and Mr. Thomas Moore.[3] Katherine Allen appointed Wm. Bridger, attorney, to release her dower rights to the property. Rec: 9 Aug 1692

29 Apr 1693 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin had land adjoining William Cook.

25 Apr 1701 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin received a grant for 200 acres on North side of Seacock Swamp.[4]

05 Feb 1702 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Arthur Allen of Lawne's Creek Par. in Surry Co. sold to Edward Boykin U.P. of I. of W. one-half of 800 acres granted to Arthur Allen and Wm. Edwards, late of James City Co. pat., 25 Apl., on main Blackwater Swamp.[5]

9 Aug 1704 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin, Sr. and William Kitchen [patented?] for the two tracts of 400 acres which they bought from Mr. William Edwards and Maj. Arthur Allen on 25 Apr 1701 land is on the southe side of Blackwater and both sides of Tuckers Swamp. Wit: John Joyner and William Kinchon. Rec: 9 Aug 1704 Edward (x) Boykin (p.3)[6]

1704 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin owned 1,100 acres of land.[7]

1705 Isle of Wight Co., VA. John Turner, appraisal by John Fulgham, Francis Williamson, Phillip Raiford & Edward Boykin.[8]

13 Nov 1713 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin received a land grant of 190 acres on South side of the Main Blackwater Swamp.[9]

16 June 1714 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin received a grant for 160 acres on the south side of the main Blackwater Swamp.[10]

23 Mar 1715 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin received a land grant for 145 acres on the south side of the main Blackwater Swamp.[11]

08 Jan 1717/8 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Deed: Richard Reynolds and wife Rebecca Reynolds of Newport parish, to Robert Edwards of the upper parish, 100 acres on the south side of the main

18 May 1723 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin, Sr., of the upper parish to his son, William Boykin of the same, for Love and Affection. -?- acres on the north side of Tuckers Swamp which runs into the main Blackwater Swamp on the west side and bounded by Cattail Branch (being part of the land said Boykin, Sr. bought from Maj. Arthur Allen and where William Boykin now lives and where Thomas Boykin did live). Wit: John Worden and Thomas Giles. Rec: 22 27 May 1723 Edward (x) Boykin (p.533) [NOTE: This reference is incomplete.]

1724 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin received a land grant.

04 Jan 1725/6 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin wrote his will. He gave his son John 530 acres. When his wife Ann died, the rest of his estate was to be divided among his other children (unnamed). They appear to be Thomas, Edward Jr., and William.[13] (Book 3, page 98) wife Ann Boykin and my son John Boykin Sole Executors. Wit.: James Atkinson, Mary Atkinson, John Dunkley.[14]

24 Feb 1728 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Estate of Edward Boykin appraised by Francis Williamson, John Dunkley, Mathew Kinchen.[15] (Ordered this date, recorded 28 Sep 1730.)

28 Mar 1728 Surry Co., VA. William Gwaltney, Sr., made his will. He gave his "Grandson Edward Boykin one cow." This was Edward Boykin, Jr., who returned an account of the estate of his father, Edward Boykin, March 1730-31 in the Isle of Wight (C11-51). This suggests that Edward Boykin, Jr., was the first-born son of Edward Boykin and wife Ann.

27 May 1728 Isle of Wight Co., VA. The will of Edward Boykin was probated. Leg: Son: John-plantation I live on and 530 acres. Wife: Ann, all the rest of estate-at her death equally divided among children. Wife Ann to have two negroes named James & Luke during her life and then to son John; Exec: wife and son John Boykin. Wit: James Atkinson, Mary Atkinson, John Dunkley.[16],[17]

bef 23 Feb 1729 Isle of Wight Co., VA. John Boykin died without a will.[18] His estate was appraised by James Turner. Later in Bertie Co, NC, in 1739 James Turner and wife Ann of IOW Co, VA, gave land to Francis Boykin "for a valuable sum," "being in actual possession of Francis Boykin." There is a suggestion here that Edward Boykin's wife was Ann and she remarried to a James Turner, but this is NOT proof, only a lead to follow. (Information from an Internet genealogy.)

22 Mar 1730/1 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Boykin, Jr., returned the final account of his father's estate (Edward Boykin, Sr.), as the executor named in the will, John Boykin, had died.[19] Examined by Francis Williamson and John Dunkley. Rec. 22 Mar 1730/1731.

19 Jun 1731 Isle of Wight Co., VA. William Boykin made his will. Wife Margaret, the plantation I bought of Thomas Boykin [named as his brother], sons: Simon, William, John, Thomas. Daughter Martha (at Roanoke land bought of James Spears to son William, land bought from brother Thomas Boykin to son John, land on Tucker's Swamp where John Phillips lived to son Thomas; land at Fishing Creek, North Carolina to the four sons.) Rec. 25 Sep 1732. Wit: William Carrell, Thomas Moore Jr., M. Kinchin.[20] He had married Margaret, daughter of Ralph Vicars.[21]

02 Mar 1732 Surry Co., VA. The will of William Gwaltney was probated (Will Book 8, page 257).[22]

- 24 Feb 1734 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Account of the estate of William Boykin ordered recorded this date, made by Thomas Vaughan, who had married the Extx. (wife Margaret). Examined by John Dunkley & Mathew Kinchin.[24]
- 21 Mar 1736/7 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Appraisal of the estate of Edward Boykin was ordered to be returned by James Turner, John Inman, John Jones. Rec. 16 Apr 1737.[25]

- 27 Apr 1741 Isle of Wight Co., VA. An account of the estate of Edward Boykin was recorded, examined by John Person, Howell Edmunds, Benjamin Blunt.[28]
- 1743 Northampton Co., NC. Edward Boykin, Jr., made his will.[29]
- 1748 Northampton Co., NC. Thomas Boykin died. (See Grimes, Abstract of Wills, p. 43.)
- 1761 Northampton Co., NC. Francis Boykin, said to be a son of John Boykin, made his will.

John Bennett Boddie, Seventeenth Century Isle of Wight County, Virginia. Baltimore, MD: Genealogical Pub. Co., 2003, p. 210. States that Francis Boykin, putative son of John Boykin was the father of William Boykin who married Elizabeth Bryant and moved to Camden, SC, about 1755. Their son Francis married Catherine. He was a Lt. in the 3rd SC Troops and later a major in Middleton's regiment of infantry during the Revolutionary War. Francis died in Baldwin Co., GA, in 1821. "His son was Dr. Samuel Boykin (1786-1848) who was the father of Thomas Cooper Boykin (1836-1902) and the grandfather of James Chambers Boykin of Selma, Alabama."

However, histories of the Baptist ministers in Kershaw Co. state that the line goes from Edward Boykin the emigrant to his son William, who died in 1731, to his son William, who moved to SC in 1855.

Bef 08 Aug 1743 Northampton Co., North Carolina. Edward Boykin died. Will written: 08 June 1743.[4] Son Thomas lands lying between Richard Walls & Meadow Branch. Son Soloman lands above Meadow Branch. Son: Hardy: land on Cypress Swamp. Son: Edward (III). Son: Benjamin. Dau: Rachel Heron. Dau: Martha. Grandson: Henry Boykin, Grandsons: Drury & Henry. Wife: Judith. Exec: Wife Judith, and son Soloman Boykin. Wit.: Chas. Campbell, Richard Wall.

NOTE: Edward Boykin, Jr., married a daughter of William Gwaltney and Alice Flake because William Gwaltney left a cow to his grandson, Edward Boykin (III). Edward's wife was Judith when he died, so she could have been a Gwaltney. It is possible that the Gwaltney daughter was someone else, who died before March 1732, and Edward Boykin, Jr., married again. Many people think his wife Judith was a Wall, daughter of Richard Wall; however, Judith Wall married William Deloach, and this couple moved into South Carolina with Edward Boykin III. Another candidate is Judith Hill, daughter of William Hill; however, I don't know of any documentation of the existence of a Judith Hill.

28 Mar 1728 Surry Co., VA. William Gwaltney, Sr., who was probably born about 1655, made his will; probated 02 Mar 1732. Leg.-daughter Ruth, wife of Robert Petway; son William; son John; grandson Thomas; grandson Edward Boykin, one cow; daughters Martha and Mary to have plantation as long as they are single.[5] Therefore, William Gwaltney, Sr., had a daughter, unnamed, who married a Boykin and had a son, Edward, born bef 1728. She may have died since William did not name a married Boykin daughter.

Alice Flake and William Gwaltney were married and the parents of three children, named by Robert Flake, Sr., in his will of 1 Jul 1696. Alice Flake was his daughter.

01 Jul 1696 Surry Co., VA. Robert Flake, Sr., deeded 450 acres to grandsons William Gwaltney and John Gwaltney, two sons of William Gwaltney of Surry County, by Alice Gwaltney, his wife... 450 acres which were patented in Isle of Wight Co. but are now in Surry Co.. Should either Will or John die, the land is to go the next son of William Gwaltney and Alice or to their daughter Kathrine.[6]

Thomas Gwaltney was born by at least 1680. He was in the tax records with his father by 1696.
 William Gwaltney was born by at least 1681.
 Katherine Gwaltney was born by at least 1683.
 Other Gwaltney children were not named.

For Alice (Flake) Gwaltney to be the mother of these children, as identified by Robert Flake, Sr., she must have been born by 1664 at the latest.

Margaret Marriott married Robert Flake, Jr. (I don't know proofs of this). This would have been about 1680/1684. They had a daughter, Alice Flake. Robert Flake, Jr., did not mention a wife's name in his will, so Margaret may have died before then.[7]

Regarding Margaret Marriott: Alice (Warren) Marriott, who married Matthias Marriott, was born about 1645, according to a legal deposition she made in 1677.[8] If she married as early as 1661, at age 16, her daughter, Margaret Marriott, could have been born about 1661/1662, if she were the first child.

Margaret could not be the mother of Alice Flake because they were born about the same time. Therefore, I conclude that Margaret must have been a second wife. There would have been an unknown first wife who was Alice's mother.
