John Boykin, son of Edward, died intestate in 1729 [Isle of Wight Wills], and his estate was appraised by James Turner. Later in Bertie Co, NC, in 1739 James Turner and wife Ann of IOW Co, VA, gave land to Francis Boykin "for a valuable sum", "being in actual possession of Francis Boykin". There is a suggestion here that John Boykin's wife was Ann and she remarried to a James Turner, but this is NOT proof, only a lead to follow.
