- abt 1575/1577    Bedminster, Somerset Co., England.    Walter Williams was born to Richard Williams and an unknown wife.[2]
  
- 08 Oct 1591     Bristol, Gloucestershire, England.    Walter Williams was apprenticed to William Yorcke[3], tanner, of Bristol, England, and Joan his wife for 7 years beginning 08 October 1591.
  
- 14 Oct 1599     Bristol, Gloucestershire, England.    Walter Williams, who had been apprenticed to William Yorcke, burgess, was admitted as a new burgess.[4]    According to the source in note 4, "The Burgess Books held at the Bristol Record Office (BRO 04358 & 04359(1-21) list all those individuals who were admitted to the freedom of the city; by which authority they were allowed to practise their respective trades and received certain other privileges such as a vote in elections." (p. 2)
  
- abt 1600         Bristol, Gloucestershire, England.    Walter Williams and Dorothea (unknown) were married.
  
- 07 Jun 1601     Bristol, Gloucestershire, England.    Joane Williams was baptized at St. Philip and St. Jacob's Church, father Walter Williams.[5]    Walter may or may not have been the Walter Williams who was the father of George Williams, immigrant to Isle of Wight Co., Virginia.
  
- 04 Jun 1606     Bristol, Gloucestershire, England.    Elizabeth Williams was baptized at St. James Church, father Walter.

George Williams, the Immigrant, Timeline

03 Oct 1618        Bristol, Gloucestershire, England. George Williams, son of Walter Williams, Tanner of Bristol, England, was baptized at St. James Church, Bristol, England.[1]

12 Nov 1625        Bristol, Gloucestershire, England. Walter Williams died.

05 Jun 1626        Bristol, Gloucestershire, England. Dorryty Williams [widow of Walter?] and John Panter were married at St. James Church.[2]

03 Nov 1634        Bristol, Gloucestershire, England. "George Williams son of Walter Williams late of the City of Bristol tanner deceased bound apprentice of Richard Robinson of the same City, taylor, and Jane his wife for 7 years. Fee 4 shillings and sixpense, freedom of Bristol and double aparel."[3]

04 Sep 1656        Bristol, Gloucestershire, England. George Williams, tailor, of Bristol left England sometime on or after 04 September 1656 for Virginia. He was indentured to Thomas Bridgman of Bristol, England, for four years.[4]  
 "George Williams of the City of Bristol taylor bound to Thomas Bridgman of the same merchant for 4 years to serve in Virginia and to have in the end thereof one axe, one house, one years provisions, two suits of apparel and fifty acres of land, according to custom of the country."[5] An indentured "servant could not have owned land for at least four years."

Dec 1656/Jan 1657    George Williams, tailor, arrived in Jamestowne, Virginia.[6]

July 1657            Isle of Wight Co., VA. Elizabeth and Pharoah Cobb sell to Samuel Haswell land where he lives, Witnesses: John Cordwent and Thomas Gardner. Later was sold to George Jr.

12 Mar 1657/8 Land Patent: Giles Driver, 200 acres adjacent to above, "beginning at a red oake on the Cypress Swamp being the corner of a patent of 750 acres belonging to Ambrose Bennett's heir", for transportation of four persons: Elizabeth Williams, Elizabeth Reynolds, Jno. Goodale, James Crow. [Virginia Patent Book 4, p169] The identity of this Elizabeth Reynolds [and this Elizabeth Williams] is unknown. She could have been the wife of Christopher Reynolds Sr., imported perhaps as a Rivers but claimed as a Reynolds by the time the headright certificate was obtained. Presumably (for the reason given above) the importation had occurred at least three years earlier. Whether her name was Reynolds at the time of arrival, is unknowable, but it was Reynolds at the time the headright certificate was granted. Whoever she is, the probability is that Giles Driver was not the importing party but rather had purchased the rights to use the

Abt 1658/63 Isle of Wight Co., VA. George Williams married an unknown daughter of Daniel Boucher.

About 1664 Isle of Wight Co., VA. William Williams was born to George Williams & his wife.

About 1667 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Elizabeth Williams was born to George Williams & his wife.

About 1670 Isle of Wight Co., VA. George Williams, Jr., was born to George Williams & his wife.

12 Jul 1665 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Sir William Berkeley to Mr. William Body, 3350 acs. for transp. of 63 persons, including Eliz. Williams (relationship, if any, to George Williams is unknown).[8]

04 Dec 1667 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Daniel Boucher made his will. Recorded 01 May 1668. Leg. to my kinsman Robert Boucher; daughter Elizabeth; to Hodges Council the younger; to William the son of William Hunt; to my son-in-law George Williams; to Mary the daughter of William Hunt; to Elizabeth Munger the daughter of John Munger; to Elizabeth Davis the daughter of John Davis, decd; if my daughter Elizabeth dies without issue estate to my kinsman Robert Boucher; remainder to the grandchildren of my deceased wife Elizabeth. Friends John Hardy and Thomas Taberer overseers. Wit: Hodges Council, William Bacon. Underwritten as follows: In lieu of the horse and furniture given to Peter Vasser, Mr. Boucher gives him the second colt etc. in the presence of Mr. Flake, Alexander Matthews, Thomas Taberer. Under his hand on the will is written Memo: there is a hogshead of tobacco in my house belonging to Mrs. Elinor Moseley, widow in Bristol. R. 01 May 1668.[9]

03 May 1669 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Edward Gibbs, appraisal of estate ordered. Appraisers: Giles Driver, Arthur Smith, Richard Sharpe, George Williams. Presented by Elizabeth Gibbs. Registered 10 May 1669. George Williams signs with a sissors mark.[10]

12 Feb 1671 Isle of Wight Co., VA. George Williams made his will (it refers to him as a tailor).[11]

07 Apr 1671 Isle of Wight Co., VA. William Bressie & wife Sussanna assign land to George Williams.[12],[13]

10 Apr 1671 Isle of Wight Co., VA. George Williams, tailor, was deeded 100 acres of land by Pharoah Cobb and his wife Anne. This land later was left by George Williams to his eldest son William Williams. The land then passed to the brother of William Williams, George Williams II and the same sold it 06 April 1700 to Richard Reynolds, Jr. who had married Elizabeth Williams daughter of George Williams I.[14]

Bef 1672 Isle of Wight Co., VA. The wife of George Williams, Sr., must have predeceased him.

09 Oct 1672 Isle of Wight Co., VA. George Williams, Tailor. Leg. son William to Mr. Pharoah Cobb; son George to Mr. Henry Applewhaite; daughter Elizabeth to Mr. William Bressie and his wife Susanna, if it shall please God to send them back to Virginia. Friends: Mr. Arthur Smith, Pharoah Cobb, and Henry Applewhaite, overseers. Witnesses: Giles Limscott, Richard Lewis, Williams Siggell. Wife was not mentioned, so she must have died. The children were under age, and were assigned to other people. William Williams was the eldest child.[15] Recorded 16 Oct 1672. 13 Oct 1672 Security: Richard Sharpe, Francis Ayres.[16]

30 Aug 1680 Isle of Wight Co., Va. Will of Ambrose Bennett: Legatees - Wife Elizabeth and the child she now goes with, reversion to Mary Beale, daughter of Benjamin Beale, Alice Blackit, Martha Rutter, daughter of Walter Rutter, Isacke Williams. Wife Extx. Overseers, Col. Arthur

Smith and Richard Reynolds Sr. Wit: Walter Rutter, Christopher Wade. Recorded 9 December 1680. [Isle of Wight Will & Deed Book 2, p214, abstracted by Chapman, p. 21] Mary Beale was evidently later the wife of John Luther [see 6 August 1695] who sold 20 acres given to her by the will of Ambrose Bennett.[17] [Who was Isacke Williams?]

ca Apr 1685 Isle of Wight Co., VA. "Richard Reynolds Jr. and wife Elizabeth and brother-in-law George Williams, orphan of George Williams, receive the estate of William Williams, decd. Pharaoh Cobb to produce the will.[18] 'Estate' meant personal property, most likely livestock and household goods in this case. We know most of this information from later records, the main significance of this one being that it tells us Richard Reynolds the younger was married to Elizabeth Williams by 1685, thus explaining the following record for February 1686."

20 Dec 1685 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Ann Tullaugh, Richard Reynolds, Isabell Williams witnesses to will of John Burnell, proved 9 Dec 1685. [Isle of Wight Will & Deed Book 2, p247, abstracted by Chapman, p. 25][19] [Who is Isabell Williams?]

9 Feb 1686 Isle of Wight Co., VA. Deed: Richard Reynolds to William Murfrey, both of Isle of Wight, no compensation noted, 100 acres in the lower parish (being land conveyed by Richard Webb to Richard Gadsbey and now in the occupation of said William Murfrey)... "wherefor was required thereunto as for Eliza. my wife". Witness: John Nevill and Robert Driver. Signed: Richard Reynolds, Eliza. (x) Reynolds. Recorded 9 Feb 1685/6 on oath of Richard and Eliza his wife. [Isle of Wight Deed Book 1, p216] This is clearly Richard Reynolds the younger. The land is evidently his wife's from her father's estate. Ten years later when Murphrey sold the land, he described it as half of a 200-acre parcel adjoining Thomas Bombridge deceased, John Askew and the Meadow Swamp. Meadow Swamp seems to be what is now called Cohoon Swamp, several miles south of Cypress Creek. An interesting connection: I can find no patent to Richard Webb, but there is a later deed by John Askew's heir, and witnessed by Murfrey's grantee, which refers to "Richard Webb's land originally taken up by Richard Staples" bordering the Meadow Swamp. The land Richard Reynolds is selling to William Murfrey is evidently quite near this land, or perhaps part of it. That raises the question of whether there was some relationship between Richard Staples and George Williams. [NOTE: There may have been more than one George Williams of similar ages.]

09 Aug 1695 Isle of Wight Co., VA. [Malachi] Hawley appoints Charles Chapman as his attorney in the suit with Mr. Robert Coleman. Witness: John Williams and Richard Reynolds. [Isle of Wight Deed Book 1, p167 abstracted by Hopkins][20]
