George Williams, Jr., of Isle of Wight Co., VA, and North Carolina, and Sarah Mann Timeline[1]

- Abt 1663 Isle of Wight Co., VA. George Williams, Jr., was born to George Williams, Sr., and unknown wife.

- 09 Oct 1672 Isle of Wight Co., VA. George Williams, Tailor, and father of William, George Jr., and Elizabeth, made his will, recorded 16 Oct 1672.[2] His wife apparently had died before he did.

Pharaoh Cobb to produce the will.[4] 'Estate' meant personal property, most likely livestock and household goods in this case. This shows Richard Reynolds the younger was married to Elizabeth Williams, George Williams's sister by 1685. William Williams was George's brother.

CHILD 8 - Rev. Robert Williams

NOTE: Although the quotation below states that the Rev. Robert Williams was born in Northampton County, NC, in 1717, Northampton County was formed from Bertie County in 1741, so it may be that he was born in Bertie. However, Bertie "was formed as Bertie Precinct in 1722 from the part of Chowan Precinct of Albemarle County lying west of the Chowan River," according to Wikipedia.com; therefore, I am showing this as the birthplace of the Rev. Williams.

NOTE 2: There are several men named Robert Williams whom researchers claim to be the son of George Williams, Jr., and Sarah Mann. I think it is very likely that the Rev. Robert Williams was their son, but I cannot prove it. The family of George Williams, Jr., had relationships with the Boykin family.

"An interesting case of the administration of discipline by the Baptists of the period came about as a result of differences between the Welsh Neck Church and Rev. Robert Williams,[Note 10] whose ministry was largely contemporary with that of Mr. Edwards:..."

Note 10: ...Rev. Robert Williams was born Dec. 20, 1717, at Northampton, N. C.; he came to Peedee in 1745, where he was ordained on Sept. 30, 1752, by Rev. Messrs. Phillip James and John Brown; he married Anne Boykin, by whom he had David, Celta [Celia?], Jehu, Mary, and Anne....David Rogerson Williams was his grandson;...." (page 65)
